Helpful suggestions for using the Window to the World Curriculum

Window to the World is a 12-lesson English as a Second Language (ESL) curriculum designed to help you build relationships with English learners. The lessons can be used with individuals, small or large groups. You do not need to be an ESL expert to use it. Many people we meet are simply looking for an American friend to help them learn to speak English.

Each lesson includes a JESUS film segment. Although the lessons follow the timeline of Jesus' life, if a particular lesson seems relevant to your student's interests, you can jump to that lesson. (Clicking on the lesson in the Table of Contents will take you right to it.)

Tips for success:

- Take the time to go through each lesson before you present it.
- Know your "audience" and assess their level of English.
- Consider adapting lessons to the abilities and interests of your new friends.
- When one or more learners have a better grasp of English (and can help the others) the lessons are more fun.
- If you have attempted to learn another language, consider sharing examples of your mistakes.

Keep in mind some of your new friends may have come from areas in the world where students were hit or beaten when they made mistakes. Give them time to adjust to a more relaxed learning environment.

You have the option to print each lesson for your students, either in color or black and white, with two slides per page. To keep the lessons organized, you might consider providing a binder and distributing the lessons as you teach them..

PART 3: FINAL THOUGHTS ABOUT THE STORY

Discussion:

What does this look like for us today?

In the beginning of this lesson, John the Baptist is telling people how to live for God. He says what is TRUE and GOOD. On the other hand, the devil tries to make us believe that true things are false. The devil also wants us to believe that false things are true. For example: It is TRUE that God loves everyone. God loves us "with a love that lasts forever" (Jeremiah 31:3). His love never stops. The devil whispers in our ears and tells lies or "twists" this truth. The devil says words that are FALSE: "You are a bad person. God cannot love you or save you."

2) If we follow the example of Jesus, we will be wise when the devil tells us lies and wants us to make bad choices.

The Bible, God's Word, tells us:

Please read these Bible verses in your heart language!**

1. John the Baptist prepares the way for the Lord. He tells the people about the coming Messiah. When God has a job for us to do, He will "prepare the way" for us also.

"In all your ways obey him. Then he will make your paths smooth and straight" (Proverbs 3:6).

2. Jesus understands when we are tempted by the devil (also called "Satan"). The devil is a very real presence in this world. We must not be tricked by Satan when he wears a disguise and tells us lies.

Jesus understands every weakness of ours, because He was tempted in every way that we are. But He did not sin (Hebrews 4:15).


He himself suffered when he was tempted. Now he is able to help others who are being tempted (Hebrews 2:18).

Be watchful and control yourselves. Your enemy the devil is like a roaring lion. He prowls around looking for someone to swallow up (1 Peter 5:8).

The devil has nothing to do with the truth. There is no truth in him. He is a liar and the father of lies (John 8:44).

God can be trusted not to let you be tempted too much, and He will show you how to escape from your temptations (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Stand against the devil and he will run away from you. Come close to God and He will come close to you (James 4:7-8).

- 3. After the funeral, sometimes the family has a short graveside service at the cemetery before the person is buried. Included is a short Bible reading and prayer, and family and friends say a final good-bye. The casket will be placed in the grave during this time.
- 4. Often instead of a FUNERAL, families choose to have a CELEBRATION OF LIFE where people share good memories or lessons they have learned from the person who died. Many times there is a slide show highlighting their life.
- 5. Driving from the memorial service to the graveside or burial place, cars drive in a line (one after the other) with their lights on.

 Other people on the roads usually show respect by stopping and waiting for the funeral cars to pass by.

- 7. Friends of the family express sympathy in different ways: by sending flowers to the funeral, giving a memorial gift or sending a sympathy card.



1. In Lessons 11 and 12, we have seen God's plan unfold: betrayal by Judas, arrest of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, trial, crucifixion, burial and resurrection. Jesus told His followers that would happen.

"Jesus then began to teach his disciples. He taught them that the Son of Man must suffer many things. He taught them that the elders would not accept him. The chief priests and the teachers of the law would not accept him either. He must be killed and after three days rise again" (Mark 8:31).

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God. Believe in me also. There are many rooms in my Father's house. If this were not true, would I have told you that I am going there? Would I have told you that I would prepare a place for you there? If I go and do that, I will come back. And I will take you to be with me. Then you will also be where I am. You know the way to the place where I am going" (John 14:1–4).

2. Jesus told us how to get there.

"Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6).

"But God is faithful and fair. If we confess our sins, he will forgive our sins. He will forgive every wrong thing we have done. He will make us pure" (1 John 1:9).

3. We must do more than know about God's love and know about the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus. Each person must reach out to receive God's gift of eternal life.

"Some people did accept him and did believe in his name. He gave them the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).

"God's grace has saved you because of your faith in Christ. Your salvation doesn't come from anything you do. It is God's gift. It is not based on anything you have done. No one can brag about earning it" (Ephesians 2:8–9).

"Say with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord.' Believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. Then you will be saved. With your heart you believe and are made right with God. With your mouth you say what you believe. And so you are saved" (Romans 10:9–10).



PART 3: FINAL THOUGHTS ABOUT THE STORY

The following explains how you can receive Christ:

You Can Receive Christ Right Now by Faith Through Prayer (Prayer is talking with God) God knows your heart and is not so concerned with your words as He is with the attitude of your heart. The following is a suggested prayer:

Lord Jesus, I need You. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins. I open the door of my life and receive You as my Savior and Lord. Thank You for forgiving my sins and giving me eternal life. Take control of the throne of my life. Make me the kind of person You want me to be.

Does this prayer express the desire of your heart? If it does, I invite you to pray this prayer right now, and Christ will come into your life, as He promised.
